Please note the short course singles event is only offered for Open age category K1 and C1 craft. There is a \$35/event discount for entering multiple events and a \$40/event discount for early bird entry.



Long Course

The course consists of multiple long laps (3.7 km each), with portage for ICF craft in designated age groups, followed by one short (750 m) lap. The start/finish line is directly in front of the rowing clubs and portage area. The course runs in an anti-clockwise direction. The portage has a jetty entrance and exit and a flat grass track, approximately 100 metres in length. The Barwon River at this location is non-tidal with minimal current.

- 1a) ICF selection class: C = ICF Canoe; K = ICF Kayak; Para. WK = Women's Kayak, MK = Men's Kayak, XK = Mixed Kayak, etc.
- 1b) Non-selection class: C = Canoe (C, TC, UC, OC, vaá, SUP), K = Kayak/ski, etc.
- 2) Same distances for mixed crews as women's crews. Same distances for singles and doubles (except U21 & U23 doubles, see note 5d)
- 3a) No portage for "non-selection" classes (even if paddling ICF K or C craft).
- 3b) ICF selection age groups must portage in accordance with ICF rules (no portage for V65+).
- 4) 10 year age groups for Masters, unless sufficient numbers to constitute both 5 year sub-groups.
- 5a) Separate U21 & U23 classes if sufficient numbers to constitute both age groups. U21 & U23 race same distance, same start.
- 5b) U21 & U23 "ICF selection class" MK1, WK1 and MC1 paddlers are eligible for U23 selection (no U21 class at Worlds).
- 5c) U21 and U23 "ICF selection class" WC1 paddlers are eligible for Open selection (no C1 W U23 class at Worlds).
- 5d) U21 and U23 ICF selection class doubles race same distance as Open (and same start as Open) for ICF Open team selection.
- 6) Separate classes for TC and C/UC assuming sufficient numbers for constituted classes for both.

Note: For 2020 PACMC purposes we shall recognize both U21 and U23 age groups for ICF-selection class singles and doubles events (assuming there are sufficient numbers to constitute classes in both age groups). However, selection to the Australian team to compete in Norway will be consistent with ICF age categories (i.e. U21 and U23 singles paddlers will be eligible for U23 team selection; U21, U23 and Open doubles paddlers will be eligible for Open team selection) subject to the performance requirements stated in the PA Marathon selection policy.





Short Course (ICF K1 and C1 Open age only)

The course consists of three short laps (1.2 km each), with two portages. The start/finish line is directly in front of the rowing clubs and portage area. The course runs in an anti-clockwise direction. The portage has a jetty entrance and exit and a flat grass track, approximately 100 metres in length. The Barwon River at this location is non-tidal with minimal current.

Novice Event

11:00 am, Sunday, 19th April.

The purpose of this event is to provide an opportunity to introduce new paddlers to competitive events in a fun environment.

The format is a 3 x $^{\sim}$ 1 km relay, using the final short lap and bottom turn of the long distance course. There are a few rules in the interests of fairness and inclusion.

- Boats: Three boats per team. At least one canoe or SUP (single or double) and at least one double kayak (TK2) per team. ICF class boats (K or C) are not permitted. PV Marathon can supply some boats for interstate teams (just let us know before hand).
- Crew: At least one mixed crew and at least one junior (U18) per team. Paddlers in other PACMC events can only enter this event if they paddle with a novice in a double. A novice is a paddler who is new to racing.
- Safety: Life jackets must be worn.

The early bird cost to enter is nil for 2020 PACMC competitors, \$10 for PA members and \$20/\$30 for junior/adult non-PA members. The event will be run by Paddle Victoria Marathon and placegetters will receive PV Marathon ribbons. Registration will be on-line via Webscorer at https://www.webscorer.com/register?raceid=207635

Life Jackets

We expect to receive an exemption from the requirement to wear life jackets. However proper fitting life jackets (i.e. done up) must be worn by:

- All paddlers competing in the Under 10, Under 12 and Under 14 categories;
- Those who are not strong and confident swimmers;
- All paddlers if the Competition Committee deems it necessary.

Every competitor must have access to a proper fitting life jacket.

Please note, inflatable life jackets are not acceptable due to the need for the paddler to be conscious to activate the life jacket and for the need for annual testing to ensure compliance.


Getting there

Corio Bay Rowing Club is located at 10 Barwon Terrace, South Geelong, on the banks of the Barwon River.

It is approximately:

- 85 km from Melbourne Airport
- 76 km from Melbourne (Southern Cross Station)
- 25 km from Avalon Airport
- 3 km from Geelong Railway Station
- 800 m from South Geelong Railway Station

Anti-Doping

Competitors, officials, volunteers and support persons participating in the 2020 Australian Canoe Marathon Championships are bound by and must comply with Paddle Australia's Anti-Doping Policy. All participants should be familiar with the policy. Under the terms of the policy, the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority (ASADA) is authorised to undertake testing during the 2020 Australian Canoe Marathon Championships.

Food

Breakfast and lunch stalls / food trucks will be available on site from Friday to Sunday. Coffee van/s will be on site from Thursday to Sunday. Water fountains will be available to re-fill water bottles.

On Sunday an afternoon tea will be held followed by presentations. Tickets can be purchased through the same on-line the registration system as for merchandise. Additional tickets can be purchased at the venue.

Merchandise

Shirts, hoodies and caps will be available for competitors, friends and family to purchase prior to the event. Items include:

- Ladies V neck and men's round neck Tee shirt in navy marl or white with the event logo on the front and names of all participants on the back;
- Unisex Hoodie in navy with the event logo on the front and names of all participants on the back;
- Ladies and Men's navy and white polo with the event logo on the front; and
- Baseball cap in white with the event logo on the front.


Weather


Weather Averages

Remember there is no such thing as bad weather, just the wrong clothing. So bring the appropriate clothing for the day, whether it be waterproof jackets and warm clothes if it's likely to rain or sun protection if it's warm and sunny.

Sun Safety

- SLIP on sun protective clothing that covers as much of your body as possible.
- SLOP on SPF 30 or higher broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen, at least 20 minutes before sun exposure. Reapply every two hours when outdoors or more often if perspiring or swimming.
- SLAP on a broad-brimmed hat that shades your face, neck and ears.
- SEEK shade.
- SLIDE on sunglasses.

Tourism

Geelong is Victoria's second largest city, located on Corio Bay, and within a short drive from popular beach-front communities on the Bellarine Peninsula as well as being the gateway to the famous Great Ocean Road, which begins just south of Geelong at <u>Torquay</u>.

The city offers visitors the chance to explore popular beach-front attractions such as Eastern Beach with its swimming enclosure, the Steampacket Gardens, dining options available on Cunningham Pier, and several coastal walks, dotted with collections of bollards depicting historic characters. Elegant architecture, colourful gardens and parks, and the backdrop of Corio Bay are all symbolic of what locals refer to as the "city by the bay".

Locations of interest for visitors include the National Wool Museum, the Old Geelong Gaol, the Botanic Gardens at Eastern Park, Geelong Museum of Motoring and Industry, and a number of other museums, galleries and historical buildings.

The Barwon River meanders through Geelong and its surrounding suburbs, fronted by a number of attractive parks and the scenic Buckley Falls in Fyansford. On its journey to the coast, the river flows through the wetlands of Lake Connewarre before entering Bass Strait at the twin towns of <u>Barwon Heads</u> and <u>Ocean Grove</u>.
